## Plymouth, Massachusetts

### International Spy Museum

Uncover the tradecraft, motivation, tools, evolution, and impact of espionage throughout history and across the globe. Test your own spy skills through RFID experiences. Explore interactive exhibits and real tools of the trade.

### The FBI Experience

The FBI tour opened its doors to the public in 1937 but was closed after the events of 9/11. Re-opened in 2017, The FBI Experience is a self-guided tour at FBI Headquarters in Washington, D.C. Open to the public, the tour features interactive multimedia exhibits, content, and artifacts—including a number of items from notable cases on display for the very first time—that help illustrate the importance of the Bureau's work to protect the nation. Visitors to The FBI Experience will learn how the Bureau operates in the field, at Headquarters, and within communities across the country. They will also gain a rare look inside the organization's investigative divisions, laboratory resources, professional occupations, and more.

### The Capital Wheel

Located at National Harbor in Maryland, the Capital Wheel soars 180 feet above the Potomac River. The Capital Wheel's 42 climate-controlled gondolas, each accommodating up to eight passengers, feature glass exteriors to maximize the panoramic views of the Washington Monument, National Cathedral, Alexandria and beyond. With its spectacular views, family-friendly appeal and cutting-edge technology - including LED lighting with a stunning spectrum of 16 million colors - the Capital Wheel is a can't-miss destination for visitors of all ages and interests.

## New York City

### Gayle's Broadway Rose

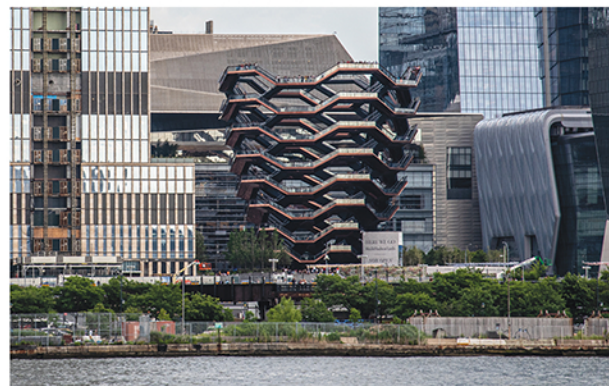

### The Downtown Experience

Powered by THE RIDE is a brand new multimedia 90-minute historical adventure exploring Downtown Manhattan's most notable landmarks and neighborhoods. Enhanced with the advanced technology of their partner Timelooper, THE DOWNTOWN EXPERIENCE is highlighted by the magic of Virtual Reality allowing visitors to travel back in time and re-live iconic moments in history.

### Hudson Yards/The Vessel

The Vessel is a 16-story, 150-foot-high structure of connected staircases between the buildings of Hudson Yards, located in the 5-acre Hudson Yards Public Square. The Vessel has 154 flights, 2,500 steps, and 80 landings that stretch from its 50-foot-wide base to its 150-foot-wide apex with the total length of the stairs exceeding 1 mile. Its unusual shape was intended to make the structure stand out like a "12-month Christmas tree." The views of the Hudson River and other iconic landmarks make the journey exceptional.
